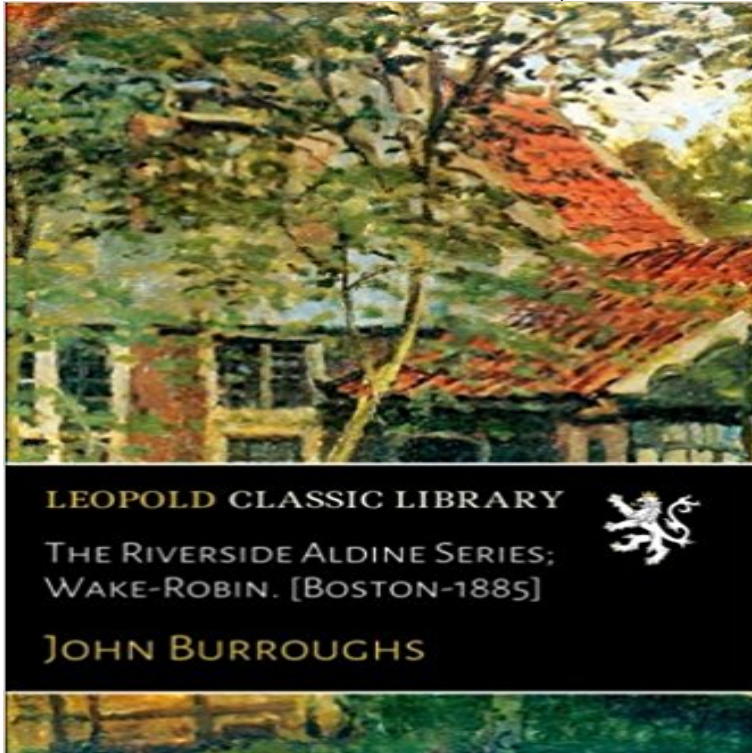


The Riverside Aldine Series; Wake-Robin. [Boston-1885]
